General Situation:

Agencies in Gallatin County are responding to the unprecedented COVID-19 pandemic and the consequences of the control measures. Agencies are focused largely on internal continuity of operations activities and contingency plans for more confirmed cases or prolonged closures.

Status

- 19 confirmed COVID-19 case in Gallatin County.
- 51 confirmed COVID-19 cases in Montana.

Significant Activities

- Gallatin County picked up 3 more positive cases on Tuesday who all had exposure to other local positive cases.
- On Tuesday Governor Bullock extended his closure order to April 10th. It also included some direction on limiting groups greater than 10 individuals.
- The Gallatin City-County Health Department Board is meeting Thursday morning to consider extending their Health Order and some other changes to match the State closer.
- There are indicators of some PPE supplies getting pushed to local levels. Working to identify what that actually is. Gallatin County is also preparing an order in coordination with the big 7 counties to China for surgical and N95 masks.
- The Policy Group is working this week on identifying economic recovery priorities for the community.

Health and Safety:

The Gallatin County Health Officer is endorsing everyone's effort to help flatten the curve on COVID-19.

- If someone is sick, they should stay home and consult their doctor. Wear a facemask if sick and around other people.
- Use good personal hygiene measures. COVID-19 is spread in respiratory droplets in close person to person contact, it is not airborne.
 - Wash hands regularly with water and soap for 20 seconds. Have hand sanitizer available for staff and visitors.
 - Avoid touching your mouth and eyes.
 - Cover your coughs, then wash your hands immediately.
 - Keep communal spaces disinfected on a regular basis.
 - Do not share dishes, glasses, cups & utensils.
- Consider social distancing. 6 feet is the magic number to be considered outside the exposure radius.
 - Allow workers to spread out and not work in tight spaces.
 - Expand the distance between staff and public.
 - Have public and/ or staff leave a buffer between themselves and service counters.
