General Situation:

Agencies in Gallatin County are responding to the unprecedented COVID-19 pandemic and the consequences of the control measures. Agencies are focused largely on internal continuity of operations activities and contingency plans for more confirmed cases or prolonged closures.

Status

- 8 confirmed COVID-19 case in Gallatin County.
- 31 confirmed COVID-19 cases in Montana.

Significant Activities

- Gallatin County picked on 4 more positive cases on Saturday's tests. One was originally credited to Lewis & Clark County, but they live in Bozeman.
- A virtual press conference is being held today at 14:00 about our current cases.
- The Gallatin County Policy Group (Chief Executive Officers and Principal Executive Officers) will be activated this coming week.
- The Call center has had consistent, but reduced volume of calls over the weekend.
- Plans are being finalized for treatment and collection sites around the county.

Health and Safety:

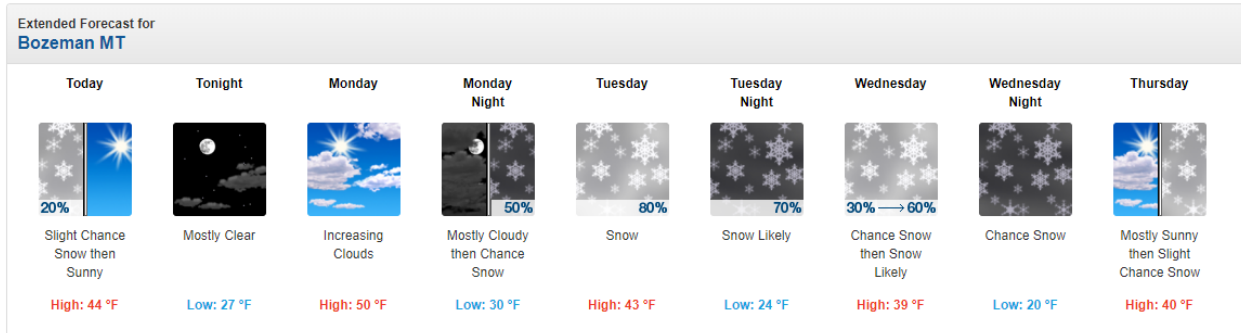
The Gallatin County Health Officer is endorsing everyone's effort to help flatten the curve on COVID-19.

- If someone is sick, they should stay home and consult their doctor. Wear a facemask if sick and around other people.
- Use good personal hygiene measures. COVID-19 is spread in respiratory droplets in close person to person contact, it is not airborne.
 - Wash hands regularly with water and soap for 20 seconds. Have hand sanitizer available for staff and visitors.
 - Avoid touching your mouth and eyes.
 - Cover your coughs, then wash your hands immediately.
 - Keep communal spaces disinfected on a regular basis.
 - Do not share dishes, glasses, cups & utensils.
- Consider social distancing. 6 feet is the magic number to be considered outside the exposure radius.
 - Allow workers to spread out and not work in tight spaces.
 - Expand the distance between staff and public.
 - Have public and/ or staff leave a buffer between themselves and service counters.
 - Evaluate the need for attending group activities in person.
