ECSB is providing limited, one-time scholarships to working families of elementary-age children (children entering first grade through children entering fifth grade) to help cover the cost of out-of-school time summer programming or care for the summer months. To be considered eligible, parents must be employed and be able to provide documentation of summer care or summer program arrangements.
