# Serve Montana Award

The Elkhorn Community Organizations Active in Disaster (COAD) received the ServeMontana Award. The purpose of the ServeMontana Awards is to recognize Montana Citizens, who have enhanced quality of life in our state through their commitment to volunteerism and service to their community.

The Elkhorn COAD serves Lewis and Clark, Broadwater, and Jefferson Counties. When it came to executing a plan to use the Lewis & Clark County Fairgrounds to launch a large-scale, drive-through vaccination site, Elkhorn COAD volunteers enthusiastically said "Yes!".

Over 360 volunteers gave thousands of hours to direct traffic, provide coffee to volunteers, and staff the snack counter. Volunteers included youth from local Boy Scout troops. To date, over 26,000 vaccines have been given at this clinic, and people all over the country are learning about the model adopted in Lewis and Clark County.
