TEMPORARY ASSISTANCE FOR NEEDY FAMILIES (TANF)

TANF Cash assistance is a program providing temporary financial assistance to needy families. The receipt of TANF cash assistance is limited to 60 months in an adults lifetime. Temporary financial assistance may be provided to the follow families and individuals:

- 1. Minor children;
- 2. Specified relatives with whom the children are living;
- 3. The minor children's blood-related/adoptive siblings with whom the children are living;
- 4. Pregnant women in their last trimester who have no other eligible children; and
- 5. Refugees with minor dependent children.
