

One of seven Child Care Resource and Referral agencies (CCR&R) in Montana, Child Care Connections serves Gallatin, Park, Meagher, Lewis & Clark, Jefferson, and Broadwater Counties.

# Quality child care is...

Quality child care is safe, stimulating, and provides a loving environment in which children mentally and physically thrive. Long-term benefits include increased school readiness, healthy eating habits, advanced verbal and intellectual skills, social and emotional skills, and a strengthened future workforce for our community.



#### **Annual Costs in Montana**

**Public College:** \$6,783

**Housing:** \$9,232

**4- year-old care:** \$8,365

Infant Care: \$ 9.518

#### Cost of child care is...

Child Care is considered affordable when it takes up **7**% or less of a household's income. On average, Montana Families pay **\$9,581 annually** or **\$793 monthly** infant care. Which is **17**% of the sate's median family Income.

## Demand for child care is...

During the 2021 program year, CCC gave 541 child care referrals in our service area. But, the demand surpasses the available slots in safe licensed care.

\*CCC received a total of 55 child care referral requests that fell outside our service area. These included requests from Arizona, California, Colorado, Indiana, Minnesota, Oregon, Texas, Tennessee, and other counties across Montana.

High cost, limited availability, and inconvenient program hours are all challenges

driving parents out of the workforce.

## What businesses are doing

Only 13% of MT employers offer paid parental leave. However, nearly three-quarters offer some type flexible work arrangements that can help meet employees child care needs.

Flexible Scheduling:
Work hours outside of the traditional 8am - 5pm.

Advanced Scheduling:
Work schedules are set at least 14 days in advance.

15%

Dependent Care Assistance Plan (DCAP):

A stipend for child care costs.

41%

Temporarily Reduce Hours: Reduced work hours, with or without pay, when child care is unavailable.

22%

Bringing Child To Work:
Allowing employees to bring their young child to work temporarily or indefinitely.

Onsite Child Care: Employer providing child care on work premises.
